MINUTES OF THE EIGHTH NCC MEETING

ISSUES	RESPONSIBILITY
1.1 Members went through the minutes.1.2 Togbe Adom Drayi II moved for the confirmation of the minutes and was seconded by Torgbe Agbesi Kpapka.	
2.1 Activities by the Action Team Members were informed about activities that have taken place since the last NCC meeting. Since reports of all these activities were forwarded to members and also captured in the second GDD Newsletter, the activities were only discussed in brief. They included a visit to the Graphic Communication Group Limited, a field trip to Akanyakrom, as well as the Institutional Networking Meeting among Dam Affected Communities, and the 1 st Annual Meeting of Dam Affected Communities. All these activities were led by the Action Team of the NCC.	
Dr. Liqa Raschid-Sally informed members about the visit of the Action Team to the Graphic Communication Group Limited. She said that the objective of the visit was to promote collaboration with the Group, and also to establish a platform on how issues on dams could be factored into the Daily Graphic Governance Dialogue series. Mr. Richard Twum Koranteng also informed members about the field trip to Akainyakrom. The purpose of the visit was to resolve concerns raised during the previous

two communities, the Chief of Battor – Togbe Emmanuel Agbesi Kpakpa – informed the gathering that, having considered all of the issues discussed during the meeting, both communities have agreed to be resettled side by side. To this effect, they have sent a letter to the BPA accordingly.

Mr. Twum finally reported on the Institutional Networking Meeting and the 1st Annual Meeting of Dam Affected Communities. He said that the two events were held back-to-back on the 16th and 17th of July, 2009. The key issues that came out of the meeting included land acquisition and ownership; the Volta River Authority Resettlement Trust Fund; participation of dam affected communities in decision-making processes; and capacity building opportunities.

Bob Alfa applauded the Action Team for the visit to the Graphic Communication Group Limited, and proposed that the Team visit other media houses as well.

2.2 GDD Newsletter

The Editor of the Newsletter, Edmund Kyei Akoto-Danso, informed members about the release of the second GDD Newsletter. He re-emphasized the relevance of the Newsletter as a mechanism for information exchange and requested comments from members to improve the Newsletter. He encouraged the Bui Power Authority and the Volta River Authority to use the platform to get across information as much as possible.

Members were informed about the impact of the Newsletter and the website of the project. Dr. Liqa Raschid-Sally said that the Secretariat had been approached by the International Water Power & Dam Construction journal to submit an article to its

	Secretariat had also been contacted by the West Africa Dialogue on Large Infrastructure	
	for further information about the Ghana Dams Dialogue, and possible synergies between

	Messrs. Ben Sackey and Ofori commended the Secretariat for the GDD Newsletter and	
	further recommended the possibility of looking for external support to produce more	
	copies and expand distribution. The Volta River Authority and the Chinese Embassy were	Secretariat
	suggested as possible sources of support.

	GTZ as one of the technical requirements of the project. As was noted by Dr. Liga Raschid-	
	Sally, following feedback from GTZ, the finalized mid-year report will be circulated to	Secretariat
	members and also uploaded onto the website.	
3. Upcoming events and activities	Dr. Liqa Raschid-Sally and Mr. Richard Twum Koranteng informed the meeting about the	
	upcoming events and activities for the dialogue process. These activities included a	
	courtesy call to the Vice President by the Hydropower Sustainability Assessment Forum	
	(HSAF) Team; a press conference to publicize the up-coming HSAF consultations and third	
	Ghana Dams Forum; the HSAF consultations with Dams Affected Communities and	
	Government Agencies & Department themselves; and the third Ghana Dams Forum.	
	Members were told of the background to the collaboration between the HSAF and the	
	Ghana Dams Dialogue (GDD) The GDD would be facilitating the meetings between the	

HSAF and relevant government agencies and Dam Affected Communities (DACs) and assist in preparing discussions on the draft Hydropower Sustainability Assessment Protocol. The HSAF consultations would seek to obtain detailed feedback from a diversity of stakeholders, especially DACs and Government Agencies, on the content and practicability of the draft Protocol. It would also raise awareness amongst the Ghana Dams Dialogue Forum members about the Protocol to ensure its usefulness and credibility.

4.2 One body for the Lower Volta Resettlement Communities

Nene Tetteh Amoako IV used the platform to inform the District Chief Executive (DCE) of the Manya Krobo District Assembly about the effort of the affected communities to form one unified body for the six affected communities of the Kpong Dam. He said, "the previous DCE initiated the process and he hopes that the present DCE will use his august office to help set up the body".

Torgbe Agbesi Kpapka thanked the Action Team and the NCC members on behalf of his community for their visit, and for facilitating an amicable settlement of issues in their community.
